

Pause your thoughts for a moment and consider this notion, why isn't Easter Friday called Bad Friday?

When people are murdered or die, it would be offensive to say out loud, 'well that was great!' When a day is commemorated, the naming of the day is designed to signify why the day is important: Mad Monday is called Mad Monday because it is the first day after the rugby league season where



the players let their hair down and not worry about training, and even the ironic call of 'thank God it's Friday,' communicates that the tiresome working week is over and we can finally look forward to some real fun on Friday night.

So why is Easter Friday called Good Friday and not Bad Friday? The truth is, for many of Jesus' friends on that first Easter Friday, the crucifixion of Jesus was an horrific day- there was nothing good about it at all. Resurrection Sunday changed everything and for the friends of Jesus, it turned Bad Friday into Good Friday. Jesus' message that his death on the cross takes our rebellion and punishment seemed hollow on Friday, but glorious after his resurrection on Sunday.
