As we prepare to celebrate with our Multicultural Lunch, here are some facts that can help us pray more specifically for those in countries with no such freedoms:

Over 65 million people worldwide are currently fleeing conflict or persecution because of their race, religion or political beliefs. In the Middle East, the massive suffering from Syria's 7 year civil war has now displaced more than half its population. Iraq continues to be a battleground, and Yemen is now nearing its third year of war.

Africa is home to long running and intensifying conflicts, including South Sudan, Somalia and Nigeria, which have created catastrophic malnutrition crises. Tens of thousands of people continue to flee Afghanistan's long running civil war. Bangladesh has become the latest refugee 'hot spot' with over half a million Rohingya people now forcibly displaced from Myanmar.

In some countries, government-sanctioned circumstances or anti-Christian laws lead to Christians being harassed, imprisoned, killed, or deprived of possessions or liberties because of their witness. Christians may also be prevented from obtaining Bibles or other Christian literature. Even in countries where governments do not actively oppose Christianity, believers suffer severe persecution from family, friends, neighbours, political and religious groups or rebels because of their witness.

We can be praying for nation's leaders; aid agencies; Christian pastors and church leaders; Christian brothers and sisters facing persecution. There is great need for medical care and also mental health now is an increasing issue for many refugees. (in coming weeks there will be prayer points for specific nations)

Saturday, 24 February Reading: Romans 8:33-39

- Pray for our services tomorrow; that people will make it a priority to be at one; for Trent as he continues the series on the Holy Spirit; that his words will be clear and applicable to our lives; that we will come with ready hearts to worship, praise and receive His Word and to act upon it as the Holy Spirit challenges each of us. Ask God to convict us of sin in our life that needs to be confessed; that we will turn away from it and seek to live godly, transformed lives.
